Resolutions in relation to the State Library.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be and he is hereby authorised to prepare a new catalogue of the books, and so fourth, in the Library, one hundred and fifty copies of which shall be printed under his superintendence, and the Librarian is also hereby authorised to make and have printed indexes to such of the Public Documents, as in the judgment of the committees of the two houses of the General Assembly on the Library, may require them, and that the Treasurer pay to him such sum of money as compensation therefor, as the Governor may order, and likewise the cost of printing the same, on the like order of the Governor, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Librarian, after such catalogue be completed and before every session of the Legislature, to make a supplemental catalogue of all books added to the Library subsequently to the publication of the general catalogue.

Resolved, That the committees on the Library, be authorised to designate such Histories, Public Documents, now in the Library, as they may deem proper, to be furnished to the Literary and Scientific Associations of Great Britain, mentioned in a list accompanying the Librarian's report, or such of them as may seem proper, the donations thereof to be accompanied with a request that they be reciprocated.

Resolved, That a joint committee be appointed to prepare a systems of regulations by which the Librarian shall be governed in the general superintendence and care of the public buildings and grounds within the State House Circle, and that said committee have power to examine the public property, and to suggest any needful repairs of the same.
