Resolved, That the printer of the state print five hundred copies of an act entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, with marginal notes, stitched in form of octavo; and it shall be the duty of the executive of Maryland to forward as soon as possible to each major-general, one copy; to each brigadier-general, two copies; to each commanding officer of a regiment, five copies; to each commanding officer of an extra battalion, two copies; to each commanding officer of a troop five copies, to be distributed to the commissioned officers of their respective regiments, extra-battalions or troops, as the case may be. And the treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay the expense of the same out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the president and trustees of the Centreville Academy, in Queen Anne's county, the sum of eight hundred dollars on the first Monday of October annually, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury; and to the trustees of Allegany county School, the sum of three hundred dollars, on the first Monday of October annually, in addition to the present donation.
