ney not exceeding thirty dollars, nor less than twenty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Levin Carey, of said county, and that the same be collected annually, by the collector of said county, and paid to such person or persons as the levy court of said county shall or may direct.

CHAPTER 105.

An act to pay the Civil List, and other expenses of Passed Dec. 27, civil government.

WHEREAS, Those who dedicate their time, Preamble. abilities and labour to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services:

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Officers salaries. Maryland, That the following officers of civil government, for the time being, shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries, in current money, for the ensuing year, to wit: The treasurer of the Western Shore, two thousand dollars; the treasurer of the Eastern Shore four hundred and fifty dollars; the auditor, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the council, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the senate, one hundred and fifty dollars; the clerk of the house of delegates, three hundred dollars; the printer to the state, twelve hundred dollars, and the messenger to the council, two hundred and fifty dollars.

AND BE IT ENACTED, That all monies which Payment of the shall remain in the treasury after discharging the journal of accounts; and all unappropriated money which may come into the treasury, be first applied to

the payment of the civil list for the ensuing year.

An act to lay out and open a Road in Worces- Passed Dec. 27, ter county.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Commissioners.

Maryland, That George Hayward, Benjamin Purnell, They shall open
Samuel Porter, Wheatly Dennis and Charles Benwidth, direcnett, junior, be, and they are hereby appointed com-tion, &c. missioners to lay out, survey, mark and bound a public road in Worcester county, not exceeding thirty feet wide, beginning at or near the plantation of William Townsend, upon the road leading from Snow Hill to Lawes' mill; thence running and passing by
