

## CHAPTER 226.

CHAP. 227.

*AN ACT to provide for the Collection of State and County Taxes in Arrear in Baltimore county.* Passed May 20, 1852.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the present sheriff and the late sheriff of Baltimore county, in pursuance of the authority conferred by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter three hundred and forty-nine, to collect the taxes by said act declared to be in arrears, whether State or county, shall be, and they are hereby required to enforce the collection of the same in the manner prescribed by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty-four, chapter two hundred and thirty-six, and shall be entitled to receive as a compensation for such forced collections, the same fees as are now authorised by law upon service of writs of fieri facias; *Provided, nevertheless,* nothing herein contained shall be construed to restrain, or in any way impair the rights secured to tax payers by the act of eighteen hundred and forty-four, chapter two hundred and thirty-six, in any case in which it may become necessary to enforce the payment of taxes in arrear, in the manner prescribed in the said act.

Sheriff required to enforce collection of taxes in arrear.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall go into effect from and after the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 227.

*AN ACT for the completion of the Unfinished Business of Baltimore County Court, as a Court of Equity, so far as the same relates to the city of Baltimore.* Passed May 17, 1852.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all the causes depending in Baltimore county court, as a court of equity, at the time of the qualification of the judge of the Superior court of Baltimore city, in which, either the land in controversy or any part thereof, is situate within the city of Baltimore, or the defendant or defendants, or any of them, reside in said city, shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be transferred to the Superior court of Baltimore city,
