

made good and valid in law, to all intents and purposes, **CHAP. 60.** as if the justices of the peace, who took the acknowledgment of the said deed, had therein certified, that the said Margaret Ann Miller, one of the parties to said deed, had been privately examined by them, out of the presence and hearing of her husband.

**SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from and after its passage. **In force.**

**CHAPTER 59.**

*AN ACT* entitled, an act to carry into effect the tenth section of the seventh article of the Constitution, so far as relates to the Surveyor of the City of Baltimore. **Passed March 24, 1852.**

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore be, and they are hereby authorised and required to prescribe, by ordinance, the duties and compensation of the city surveyor now elected, or hereafter to be elected or appointed, pursuant to the tenth section of the seventh article of the constitution. **Duties and compensation of surveyor to be prescribed by ordinance.**

**SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from its passage. **In force.**

**CHAPTER 60.**

*AN ACT* to provide for running and marking that portion of the boundary line between the States of Maryland and Virginia, extending from Smith's Point, at the mouth of the Potomac River, to the Atlantic Ocean. **Passed March 29, 1852.**

**WHEREAS,** It is of great importance that the territorial limits of the State of Maryland, be clearly defined, her boundaries permanently established and marked, and where these landmarks are either lost or destroyed, that they be refixed and renewed; *and whereas,* the true location of that portion of the line separating the State of Virginia, from the State of
