*Resolved*, That the Governor transmit a copy of these resolutions to the Senators and Representatives of Maryland in the Congress of the United States.

### No. 11.

Passed May 18, 1852. *Resolutions in relation to a Light on Fort Sollers.*

WHEREAS, The fortification now in course of erection, in the Patapsco river, on the flats at Sollers' point, lying in the track of small vessels passing up or down the said river, constitute a dangerous impediment to navigation, Therefore;

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress, be, requested to use their effort to have a light kept on Fort Sollers, in Patapsco river, near Baltimore.

*Resolved further*, That his Excellency the Governor, be requested to forward a copy of the foregoing resolution to our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States.
