238. An act to alter and change the name of William Henry Shipley, of Carroll county, to William Henry Gorsuch.

239. An act to extend the civil jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and to prescribe their powers and duties.

240. An act to amend an act entitled, an act for the preservation of fish in the waters of Talbot, Dorchester and Caroline counties, passed December session, 1843, chapter 142.

241. An act to alter and amend an act incorporating the Maryland Institute for the Promotion of the Mechaenic Arts, passed December session, 1849, chapter 114, so as to allow said institute to establish a department of Analytic Chemistry, and confer diplomas upon graduates thereof.

242. An act to amend an act entitled, an act authorising the appointment of an inspector and wood corder at Clarksville and its vicinity, in Baltimore county, passed at December session, 1847, chapter 251.

243. An act to provide for the re-building of the State's wharf, on Frederick street dock, and the repairing of numbers one, two and four State Tobacco Warehouses, in the city of Baltimore.

244. An act to authorise the county commissioners of Prince George's county, to appoint a proper person to superintend the removal of the school house in primary school district, number five, in the second election district of said county.

245. An act to declare the assent of the Legislature of Maryland to the bequest of Catharine Chambers, late of Queen Anne's county, to the Methodist Episcopal Church, called Salem, and also the Methodist Episcopal Church in Spaniard's Neck, and to appoint trustees for said churches.

246. An act to make valid a deed from Eli Lily, of Baltimore county, to William Disney, in trust, for Edward Lilley, notwithstanding the informality of the certificate of identification of the party grantor.

247. An act entitled, an act to regulate the sessions of the Orphans' court of Baltimore county, and the compensation of its bailiff.

248. An act to provide for the establishment of an almshouse in Carroll county.

249. An act to make valid a certain deed of conveyance from Elijah Reynolds, Edward T. Tarring, Alexander Brown, Joseph W. Abrahams, and Edwin Wilmer, trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in the village of Port Deposit, to Rebecca Cresswell.

250. An act to exempt the members of the city council of Baltimore from the performance of militia and jury duty during their sessions.
