287. An act for the benefit of the public schools of the city of Baltimore.

288. An act to regulate the issuing of license to free negroes and mulattoes, and to prevent their employment as clerks in Som-

erset, Worcester and Anne Arundel counties.

289. An act to authorise the county commissioners for Dorchester county to adopt and use as evidence of the ownership of assessable property in the said county, for the purpose of taxation, the former assessment list of 1851, now in the hands of the collectors.

290. An act to provide for the per diem allowance of the judges

of the Orphans' court of Anne Arundel county.

291. An act declaring it a misdemeanor to remove sand or gra-

vel from the shores of the Potomac river.

292. An act allowing to Nancy Coward, widow of William Coward, a Lieutenant in the American Revolution, a pension, and appropriating a sum of money for the payment thereof.

293. An act to incorporate the Mount Vernon Hotel company

in the city of Baltimore.

294. An act to incorporate the St. Mary's Savings Institution. 295: A supplement to an act entitled, an act to erect a town in Talbot county, by the name of St. Michael's, passed at November session, 1804, chapter 82.

296. An act to authorise the mayor and city council of Baltimore, to appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty thousand dollars for removing the obstructions from the bed of the Patapsco river, by taxation or otherwise.

297. An act relating to non-resident guardians of infants living out of this State, and having property therein in the hands of trus-

tees appointed by will.

298. An act to authorise certain trustees, or their successors, or the survivor of them, to sell and convey the parsonage house and lot of the Methodist Episcopal church, in the Church Hill circuit, and to purchase another parsonage house and lot with the proceeds of said sale.

299. An act to compensate the families of persons killed by the

wrongful act, neglect or default of another person.

300. An act to pay to the Captain of the Eckhart Light Artillery company, a sum of money for repairs to gun carriages belonging to the State, and for harness.

301. An act to authorise searches of and abstracts to be taken from the records of the late orphans' court for Baltimore county,

by the register of wills for said county.

302. An act for the erection of a hospital for the insane in this

303. An act to authorise William Ott of Frederick county, to sell his negro man Resin Thomas, a slave for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State.

304. An act to incorporate the Baltimore, Carroll and Frederick

Rail Road company.
