a list of insolvencies, for which the said Edward Dorsey, of R., never received a credit in his settlement with the Treasurer of the State, and a sum of money equal to the said sum of forty-seven dollars and eighty cents is hereby appropriated for the purpose aforesaid, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from and after its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 103.

AN ACT increasing the per diem of the Bailiff of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore city. Passed March 16, 1852.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, the bailiff of the Orphans' Court of Baltimore city, shall receive two dollars per diem, for his services, for every day that he shall serve, instead of the sum of one dollar now received by said Bailiff. Per diem increased.

CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT relating to the fees of Clerks and Registers of Wills, of the several counties of this State and the city of Baltimore, whose terms have recently expired by Constitutional limitation. Passed March 16, 1852.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That all fees due to the late clerks of the several County Courts, and the registers of wills in the several counties of this State, and the city of Baltimore, whose terms of service have expired by constitutional limitation, shall be received and collected by the sheriffs of the several counties of this State and of the city of Baltimore, in the same manner as fees due and owing such officers have been heretofore collected; and such sheriffs shall use and have the same means of enforcing payment of, and collecting said fees, and be liable to said clerks and registers, in the manner now provided by the existing laws of this State; *Provided*, Fees to be collected by sheriff. Proviso.
