

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take In force. effect from the day of its passage.

CHAPTER 224.

AN ACT to make additional provision for the instruction of Indigent Blind persons, inhabitants of this State. Passed
Mar. 10, 1854.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sum annually appropriated for the instruction of indigent blind persons in and by the first section of the act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at December session eighteen hundred and forty-nine, chapter two hundred and nine, entitled an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons, inhabitants of this State, be and the same is hereby increased to not exceeding four thousand dollars. Sum increased
\$1,000.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the Governor of Maryland whenever he shall be satisfied that the Maryland Institution for the instruction of the blind is prepared to educate blind persons, be, and he is hereby authorised to place or have placed in the said institution for education such indigent blind persons as shall thereafter be educated at the expense of the State or such and so many of them as he may deem expedient. Authority of
Governor.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That whenever the Governor of this State shall certify to the Comptroller of the Treasury, that he is satisfied that the sum of five thousand dollars has been paid from private contributions to the said institution, the Treasurer of this State, shall upon the warrant of the Comptroller pay to the Treasurer of the said institution, the sum of five thousand dollars; and the sum of five thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for that purpose out of any unappropriated money in the treasury. Sum appro-
priated.
