SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 233.

AN ACT to abolish the Office of Inspector of Plaster of Paris.

Passed
Mar. 10, 1854.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter two hundred and eighty-two creating the office of inspector of Plaster of Paris, and the supplement thereto of December session eighteen hundred and thirty-three, chapter two hundred and seventy-five, defining the duties of the said inspector, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the State's Chemist, or his assistant, whenever an application is or may be made to him by any person desiring to purchase or sell any plaster of paris offered for sale within the limits of this State, upon the presentation of a sample to analize the same and return a certificate to the applicant of the properties of said sample, and shall receive therefor a fee of fifty cents per sample.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
