

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said flour inspector for Cumberland shall be allowed to charge and receive five cents for each and every barrel of flour inspected by him, and marked with his mark. Charge for inspection.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That if any person shall sell, and dispose of, within the limits of the said town of Cumberland, for consumption within the said town, any flour that has not been previously inspected by the flour inspector of said town, the persons so offending shall forfeit the sum of one dollar for each and every barrel so sold, to be recovered as other small debts out of court. Forfeiture.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the first day of May next. In force.

AN ACT to incorporate the Church Extension Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the city of Baltimore, and Precincts. Passed Mar. 10, 1854.
