AN ACT to make valid a bill of sale from a certain
Feb. 24, 1854.

Dorchester county.

Preamble.

Whereas, it is represented to this General Assembly, that on the twenty-fourth day of August, eighteen hundred and forty-nine, a bill of sale was executed by a certain James Davis, administrator of Tilghman Davis, of Caroline county, deceased, to a certain John L. Willis, of Dorchester county, for certain negro slaves therein named; and whereas, it was omitted to record the said bill of sale within the time specified by law; therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act the said bill of sale above described shall be as good and effectual for all purposes as if the same had been recorded within the time specified and limited by law for the recording of bills of sale; Provided, nothing in this act shall affect the rights of bona fide purchasers, without notice, who have become so before the passage of this act.

In force. Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from its passage.
