CHAPTER 85.

AN ACT to incorporate a company to erect a Bridge over the Patuxent River, between Anne Arundel and Mar. 1, 1854. Prince George's counties,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Incorporated. of Maryland, That William B. Hill, John F. Lee and Richard S. Hill of Prince George's county, and such citizens of this State, as may be associated with them, be, and they are hereby made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Woodland Bridge Company, and as such may sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, and have perpetual succession for the purpose of erecting a toll bridge over the Patuxent river, between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties, at or near Woodland, Prince George's county, and above Bristol in Anne Arundel county, and making causeways and roads thereto; the capital of which company shall not exceed fifteen thousand dollars to be divided into one hundred and fifty shares of one hundred dollars each.
