the streets or road as contemplated by this act to be opened and extended, shall be set up and sold at public auction by the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them, and the money arising from the sale thereof, shall be applied to pay the damages which may be sustained in consequence of the opening and extending the streets and road as aforesaid.
