necessary for the settlement and passing their ac-  
counts with the levy court.

9. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the trustees  
appointed by virtue of this act, shall meet four times  
a year to wit : The second Monday in June, Octo-  
ber, January and April, or oftner if need be, at their  
discretion, and for every day that they serve in dis-  
charge of their duties under the provisions of this  
act, the said trustees shall each receive for their ser-  
vices, the sum of two dollars per day, to be levied on  
the county and paid to them by the collector.

Clerk's com-  
pensation.

10. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the clerk of  
said court shall be allowed twenty five cents for each  
certificate of appointment which he shall make out  
and deliver to the sheriff ; and the sheriff shall be al-  
lowed fifty cents for the delivery of each of the said  
certificates to the persons appointed, all of which  
charges and allowances are to be levied, collected  
and paid over as other county charges are.

Out pension-  
ers.

11. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the trustees  
in their discretion may provide for any number of  
out pensioners, any law to the contrary notwithstand-  
ing.

Certain sup-  
plements re-  
pealed.

12. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the act en-  
titled, a supplement to the act of seventeen hundred  
and eighty five, and the supplementary acts thereto,  
which provide for the poor of Dorchester county,  
passed at November session eighteen hundred and  
cleven shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Laws incon-  
sistent with  
this repealed.

13. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any thing  
in the said original act or the supplements thereto,  
which is repugnant to, or inconsistent with the provi-  
sions of this act, shall be, and the same is hereby re-  
pealed.



CHAPTER 13.

Passed Nov.

*An Act for the relief of John Farekarson, of  
Dorchester county.*

Preamble.

WHEREAS, John Farekarson, by his humble pe-  
tition to this General Assembly, hath set forth, that  
he emigrated to the United States, from the United  
Kingdom of Great-Britain and Ireland, whereof he  
was formerly a subject, with an intention of becom-  
ing a citizen of the said United States, and that he  
did in pursuance thereof, at a county court of the  
State of Maryland, held for Dorchester county afore-  
said, at Cambridge in the said county, on Monday  
the eighteenth day of March, in the year of our
