and for filling up lots and for establishing corners of lots, shall be a lien upon the property chargeable with

the same under the provisions of this act.

12. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners are authorised and empowered to employ a sweeps. proper person or persons for the purpose of sweeping the chimnies in said precincts, under such regulations as they may think proper; and if any person will not suffer his, her or their chimney to be swept once in every two months, and the same afterwards takes fire, on conviction thereof, shall pay a fine not exceeding ten dollars, to be recovered by the commissioners before any justice of the peace.

13. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all forfeit- Fines and forurs and fines received and collected under this act, feitures. shall be appropriated to the defraying of all expenses incurred by the commissioners for record books,
