WHEREAS, It is represented to this General Assembly, that a new Theatre is about to be erected on Holliday-street in the city of Baltimore, and that the extension of an open portico in front of the said Theatre as far as the curb or curb stones of the street, would greatly contribute to the convenience and

safety of the citizens: Therefore,

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for the proprietors of the lot on which the Theatre now stands in the city of Baltimore, when a new Theatre shall be erected or erecting on said lot, to extend an open portico from the front of said Theatre, on a level with the box lobby, over the foot pavement of Holliday-street, as far as the curb or curb-stones: Pra-
