(House Joint Resolution 21)

House Joint Resolution concerning the routing of the proposed East-West Radial Expressway in the 900 block of Tyson Street in Baltimore and expressing opposition to the extinction of said block.

WHEREAS, it has come to our attention that the Baltimore City Planning Commission proposes to route the East-West Radial Expressway through the 900 block of Tyson Street; and

WHEREAS, Tyson Street is a unique and nationally known example of private urban renewal that is not only a source of pride to the citizens of Baltimore, but also an inspiration to the City's greatly expanded urban renewal program; and

WHEREAS, the privately sponsored rehabilitation of Tyson Street has more than trebled the assessed value of street property in the last decade and has thereby brought substantially increased revenue to the City of Baltimore; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Baltimore are so interested in Tyson Street that the Tyson Street Association has been able to contribute thousands of dollars to local charities in the past 6 years through the medium of holding an annual Open House Day and turning all proceeds over to a different charity each year; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Maryland has previously indicated its concern for the preservation of Tyson Street, by providing in Chapter 521 of the Acts of 1957 that none of the funds appropriated thereby may be used to condemn property in the 900 block of Tyson Street, or its immediate vicinity; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly of Maryland to preserve all rehabilitated property in the vicinity of the new State
