Office Building as a means of stimulating residential development of the area in the best interests of State employees and the tax-payers of the State of Maryland; and

Whereas, there are certain areas in the vicinity of Tyson Street which have not been and are not scheduled for rehabilitation and through which the proposed East-West Radial Expressway could readily be routed with benefit to the City's appearance and taxable basis; and

Whereas, the Baltimore City Planning Commission has already prepared alternate routes for the East-West Radial Expressway which would preserve Tyson Street; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That this body is unalterably opposed to the extinction of the 900 block of Tyson Street, and it is the sense of said Body that any present plans to route the East-West Radial Expressway through the 900 block of Tyson Street be revised to by-pass said area, and that none of the property in said area be condemned for the purpose of said Expressway; and that copies of this resolution be forwarded by the Chief Clerk of the House to the Federal Commissioner of Public Roads, the State Roads Commission of Maryland, the Department of Public Works of Baltimore City, Baltimore City Planning Commission, and the Urban Renewal and Housing Agency.

(House Joint Resolution 27)

House Joint Resolution requesting the Congress of the United States to authorize the Army Corps of Engineers to make a survey of the Patuxent River in regard to flood control.

WHEREAS, The Patuxent River flows through Prince George's County, Howard County and Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, At the present time, there is inadequate flood control of the Patuxent River; and

Whereas, Because of the inadequate flood control, the possible flooding of the Patuxent River constitutes a threat to the health and welfare of the people living in these three counties; and

Whereas, The General Assembly of Maryland believes it is desirable that the Army Corps of Engineers make a survey of this sit-
