

THE RIGHT TO ENTER ANY INDUSTRIAL PLANT, PLACE OF BUSINESS OR PUBLIC PREMISES AT REASONABLE HOURS IN ORDER *to carry out the investigations authorized by this section, and in addition said Board, its agents or employees, shall have such right of entry whenever necessary to carry out any of the duties imposed upon them by this Article. Any person interfering with, or denying entry to the said Board, its agents or employees, while engaged in such performance of duties, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars.*

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.*

CHAPTER 85

(Senate Bill 41)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 299 and 385 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland and Baltimore City Charter (1949 Edition), title "Baltimore City", sub-titles "Criers, Bailiffs, Watchmen and Stenographers", and "Jurors", as said Sections were amended by Chapter 270 of the Acts of 1951, increasing the compensation of the court stenographers for the several courts of Baltimore City and the stenographer assigned to the Grand Jury of said City.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 299 and 385 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland and Baltimore City Charter (1949 Edition), title "Baltimore City," sub-titles "Criers, Bailiffs, Watchmen and Stenographers", and "Jurors", by and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:*

299. The Judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City are authorized and directed to appoint from time to time as many court stenographers, not exceeding in number altogether the number of said judges, as shall in their discretion be required for the services of the several courts of Baltimore City, who shall be sworn officers of the court, and shall each be paid a salary of ~~Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000)~~ *Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000)* per annum when such stenographers shall be required to attend the courts regularly, or ~~twelve~~ *twenty* dollars per diem for each day of actual employment when he shall be appointed to attend only when his services shall be specially required by the judges; the said salaries to be paid in like manner as the salaries of the other officers of the courts are now paid, as prescribed in Section 293. Every official court stenographer of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, including the stenographer assigned to the Grand Jury, who after
