CHAPTER 156

(House Bill 427)

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Wicomico County", sub-title "County Commissioners", said new section to be known as Section 23A and to follow immediately after Section 23 thereof, ~~relating to travel AND ANY OTHER expenses incurred by the County Commissioners of Wicomico County.~~ RELATING TO TRAVEL AND ANY OTHER NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE EXERCISE OF THE OFFICIAL DUTIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WICOMICO COUNTY.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a new section be and it is hereby added to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Wicomico County", sub-title "County Commissioners", said new section to be known as Section 23A and to follow immediately after Section 23 thereof, and to read as follows:

23A. Each County Commissioner shall receive certain allowances, to be determined by the Board of County Commissioners, for traveling AND ANY OTHER expenses incurred during the exercise of the duties which result from his being County Commissioner NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE EXERCISE OF HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. *The total amount received by the County Commissioners, as a group, for such travel AND ANY OTHER expenses, shall not exceed \$500.00 per annum.*

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.
