Maryland (1951 Edition), title "State Police", sub-title "State Police Retirement system", be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

- (15) "Average final compensation" shall mean the average annual earnable compensation of an employee during his last THE ten five CONSECUTIVE years of service as an employee, DURING WHICH HIS EARNABLE COMPENSATION WAS HIGHEST or if he had less than ten five years of service, then his average earnable compensation for his total service.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1955.

## CHAPTER 264

## (Senate Bill 173)

- AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 1(15) of Article 73B of the Annotated Code of Maryland 1951 Edition), title "Pensions", providing that the term "average final compensation" shall mean the average annual earnable compensation of a member of the State Employees Retirement System for the five consecutive years of service during which his earnable compensation was highest, instead of the ten consecutive years during which his earnable compensation was highest.
- SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 1(15) of Article 73B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Pensions", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
- (15) "Average final compensation" shall mean the average annual earnable compensation of an employee for the [ten] five consecutive years of service as an employee during which his earnable compensation was highest, or if he had less than [ten] five years of service, then his average earnable compensation for his total service.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1955.
