

Sec. 3 2. *And be it further enacted, That Section 165A be and the same is hereby added to Article 48 of said Code, title "Inspections", sub-title "Boiler Rules", to follow immediately after Section 165 thereof, and that Section 169 of said Article and sub-title be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with amendments, all to read as follows:*

165A. The Board of Boiler Rules, together with all its powers and duties, shall be under the administrative and operational direction and control of the Commissioner of Labor and Industry, as provided in Article 89 of this Code, in the sub-title "Occupational Health and Safety". Rules and regulations formulated by the Board of Boiler Rules shall be subject to the approval of the Occupational Health and Safety Advisory Board, and shall be finally adopted and promulgated, if at all, by the Occupational Health and Safety Advisory Board.

169. The Commissioner of Labor and [Statistics] *Industry* is hereby charged, directed and empowered:

To employ, [subject to the approval of the Governor,] *under the provisions of Article 64A of this Code*, deputy inspectors who shall have passed the examination provided for in Section 171.

The Chief Inspector and his deputy inspectors shall have free access for himself and his said deputies, during reasonable hours, to any premises in the State where a boiler is being constructed or is being installed or operated in accordance with the provisions of this sub-title.

To prosecute all violators of the provisions of this sub-title *and to issue, suspend and revoke inspection certificates allowing boilers to be operated, as provided in this sub-title.*

The Commissioner of Labor and [Statistics] *Industry* is hereby empowered to set up a special fund from collections made under this sub-title to be drawn upon to cover the cost of necessary expenses incurred by the administration of this sub-title, to be supplemented if necessary, from general funds, until such time as this department shall become self-supporting.

To enforce the laws of the State governing the use of boilers and to enforce the rules and regulations of the Board of Boiler Rules.

To keep a complete record of the type, dimensions, age, condition, pressure allowed upon, location and date of the last inspection of all boilers to which this sub-title applies.

To publish and distribute among manufacturers and others requesting them copies of the rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Boiler Rules.

Sec. 4. *And be it further enacted, That any powers, duties or programs as to safety carried on by, or authorized to be carried on by the Public Service Commission of Maryland, be and the same are hereby transferred to the Commissioner of Labor and Industry, under the provisions established hereinabove in this Act.*

SEC. 3 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, THAT ANY PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATION WHICH IS SUBJECT TO THE REGULATORY POWER OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT.
