- (6) Collect and maintain records of construction costs for public improvements, with particular emphasis on the cost of school buildings in other counties, cities and states in order to arrive at the most economical methods for planning and construction of school buildings.
- (7) (5) Collect and maintain a complete and accurate file of drawings and plats of the location and situation of all County buildings and public improvements.
- (8) (6) On or before the first day of March of each year, file with the Board of County Commissioners a report on his activities during the preceding calendar year.
- (9) (7) Perform such other duties as may be delegated to him or requested by the Board of County Commissioners.

All decisions, recommendations and duties of the Building Engineer as provided in this section shall be made or performed subject to the final approval of the County Commissioners.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.

CHAPTER 453

(Senate Bill 499)

AN ACT to repeal Sections 312 and 313 of Article 18 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Queen Anne's County", sub-title "Officers' Fees", relating to the fees of officers in Queen Anne's County.

Whereas, The amount and form of fees of officers are now established by the Annotated Code of General Laws, therefore it is desirable to repeal these confliction provisions; now therefore

- SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 312 and 313 of Article 18 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Queen Anne's County", sub-title "Officers' Fees", be and they are hereby repealed.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.
