(9-1) Criers in Dorchester County shall each receive Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$7.50) per day.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.

CHAPTER 555

(Senate Bill 11)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sub-section 103(c) of Article 66½ of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Motor Vehicles", sub-title "Administration—Registration—Titling", correcting certain wording in said sub-section, and adding a provision for refusal, REVOCATION or suspension without preliminary hearing for at least thirty (30) days if a licensee under 21 years of age has been convicted of a second moving violation within a period of one year RELATING GENERALLY TO THE REFUSAL, REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATOR'S LICENSE IN THIS STATE.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sub-section 103(c) of Article 66½ of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1951 Edition), title "Motor Vehicles", sub-title "Administration—Registration—Titling", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

103 (c). The Department is hereby authorized to SHALL refuse or [suspend] revoke the license of an operator or chauffeur without preliminary hearing upon a showing by its records or other sufficient evidence that the applicant or licensee has committed BEEN CONVICTED OF an offense for which mandatory revocation of license is required upon conviction [.], or AND shall refuse, REVOKE or suspend without preliminary hearing for not less than thirty days if a license under 21 years of age has received two final convictions involving a motor vehicle actually in motion not arising out of the same incident, within a period of one year AS PROVIDED IN SEC. 102 (B) OF THIS ARTICLE, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT WHEN A MINOR IS NOTIFIED OF SUCH REFUSAL, SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION, SAID NOTICE SHALL ADVISE THE LICENSEE OF HIS RIGHT TO A HEARING UNDER SEC. 103 (D) OF THIS ARTICLE.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1955.
