on the graded list (provided always that he has a passing grade) shall be certified. If in any county or legislative district there are fewer applicants than its quota either available for certification or able to accept or use the scholarship, the number by which the quota is unfilled shall be added to the total for certification on the A Statewide list-SELECTED FROM THE UNFILLED QUOTAS OF ANY COUNTY OR LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT ON THE BASIS OF THE HIGHEST GRADES. It is the legislative intent that applicants be certified for the full number of scholarships, and that vacancies and unfilled scholarships and unused funds be distributed so long as the requirements of this section are observed.

- (e). Any applicant certified for a scholarship in education may place the certification for the next ensuing scholastic year with any one of the several eligible institutions as defined in Sub-section (b) of this Section. The institution at its discretion may reject the applicant according to its admission standards, or if he appears by reason of character, temperament or other cause to be of unsatisfactory potential as a teacher in the public school system of this HOWEVER, PROVIDED. THAT THE RESPECTIVE INSTITUTIONS IN ACCEPTING SAID APPLICANTS SHALL TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION THE FINANCIAL CONDITION OF THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF THE SEVERAL APPLICANTS AND NO APPLICANT WHOSE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS ARE ABLE TO PAY SAID TUITION AND/OR BOARD SHALL BE ACCEPTED. Once appointed to a scholarship and accepted by one of the eligible institutions, the applicant may hold it for four years subject to the following conditions: (1) THAT HE GIVE A BOND TO THE STATE OF MARYLAND, IN SUCH AMOUNT AND WITH SUCH SECURITY AS MAY BE AP-PROVED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE ELIGIBLE INSTITU-TION, THAT HE WILL TEACH IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THIS STATE FOR NOT LESS THAN TWO YEARS AFTER LEAVING THE ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION, (1) (2) that he be enrolled in the institution's curriculum leading to a teacher's certificate in the public school system of Maryland, (2) (3) that his grades be passing and in the upper fifty per centum of all persons enrolled in the institution, and (3) (4) that in the judgment of the institution, his character, temperament and deportment be of satisfactory potential for a teacher in the public schools of Maryland.
- (f). Over a period of four consecutive scholastic years, at the maximum rate of two hundred ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-TWO annually, the maximum of eight hundred SIX HUNDRED AND EIGHT applicants may be certified for and placed in scholarships in education. Thereafter the program shall continue from year to year, subject to the same annual and overall maximum figures.
- (g). Funds for the granting of scholarships in education shall be included in the Budget from year to year, to be administered by the State Department of Education. Each applicant shall be allowed as a maximum the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.) for each scholastic year during which he conforms to the requirements of this section. The payment shall be made to the institution, if its regular charges for the particular applicant are less than this sum for the scholastic year, the institution shall be paid the full amount due it and the remainder of the maximum five hundred dollar allowance
