(House Joint Resolution 16)

House Joint Resolution requesting the Governor to appoint a commission to study methods and means whereby the municipalities and political subdivisions of this State which are required to build sewage disposal and sanitary facilities in order not to pollute the streams, creeks, rivers, of Maryland and the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries, can finance said sewage disposal and sanitary systems, and to make specific recommendations for legislation to the General Assembly of Maryland if said legislation be necessary.

WHEREAS, It is the public policy of the State of Maryland to require that all of Maryland's inland streams, rivers, creeks, and lakes as well as the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries be kept free and clear of pollution; and

Whereas, All citizens of Maryland wherever they live benefit by and from this policy of clean water through the sporting facilities thereby enhanced as well as from the greater productivity of the commercial products of our waters; and
