

CHAPTER 103.

AN ACT to continue in force the act passed at January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-two, chapter three hundred and sixteen, also the act passed January session, eighteen hundred and fifty four, chapter forty six, relating to the appointment of a Commissioner to take testimony to perpetuate the lost records in Dorchester county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Act of Assembly passed at the January session eighteen hundred and fifty two, chapter three hundred and sixteen, entitled, "an act to authorize the appointment of a Commissioner to take testimony to provide for the recording of Wills and other papers, of which the originals were lost by the burning of the court house in Dorchester county, and to remedy as far as practicable, the evils likely to arise from the destruction of the records of said county, and the supplements thereto, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and fifty four, chapter forty six, be and the same are hereby continued in force until the tenth day of March, eighteen hundred and fifty eight.
