

so much thereof, as they may deem expedient, for the use and benefit of the academies or schools of said county, in such proportions and under such regulations as they, the said commissioners may think right and proper.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 269.

AN ACT to provided for the payment of legal fees due to James L. Martin, for services rendered as prosecuting attorney. Passed Mar. 10, 1866.

WHEREAS, James L. Martin, by the direction of the Governor of this State, assisted the Prosecutor of Caroline county, in the prosecution of Theodore R. Lockerman, put upon his trial in said county for an assault with intent to murder; and whereas the said Martin, also assisted the Prosecutor of Dorchester county, in the prosecution of Solomon T. Willson put upon his trial in said county for homicide; and whereas it is right and proper that the said Martin should be remunerated for the services thus rendered; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the payment of the claim of James L. Martin, for services rendered by him, as attorney for the State, in Caroline and Dorchester counties; and the Comptroller is hereby directed and empowered to draw on the treasurer for said amount. Sum appropriated.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage. In force.
