SEC. 11. And be it enacted, That the said com- Meetings. missioners shall establish some suitable place for their meetings, and give public notice thereof, and shall hold stated sessions for the transaction of business, once or oftener, in every month.

SEC. 12. And be it enacted, That the said commisate ordinances sioners, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby and by-laws. empowered to make all such ordinances, by-laws and regulations, for the good government, improvement, and benefit of the said town, and for the health and advantage of the inhabitants thereof, as to them may appear just and proper; to restrain all cisorders and disturbances, to prevent and abate all nuisances and inconveniences, and may do all such acts, and things, as may be necessary to carry into effect this act, or promote the welfare and prosperity of said town; Provided, they be not contrary to the constitution and laws of this State, and of the United States; and may establish and enforce such reasonable penalties, fines and forfeitures, for offences and delinquencies, as they may deem proper, not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars in any one case.

CHAPTER 313.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay Rich- 10, 1856. Passed Mar. ard B. Carmichael, Grafton L. Dulaney, and D. C. H. Emory for their services as arbitrators under the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter three hundred and forty-seven, entitled a supplement to an act for the relief of Passmore McCullough.
