

CHAPTER 318.

AN ACT for the relief of the Commissioners of Montgomery county. Passed Mar. 10, 1856.

WHEREAS, the sheriff of Montgomery county, collected from the sureties, on the recognizance of Thomas M. Offutt, by default, have paid into the treasury, the sum of two thousand dollars; and whereas, Montgomery county has paid the expenses of said suit, amounting to two hundred and seventy-one dollars and eleven cents, (\$271 11.) Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the State, be and he is hereby authorised and directed to issue his warrant to the Treasurer to pay to the order of the Commissioners of Montgomery county, the sum of two hundred and seventy-one dollars and eleven cents, amount of expenses incurred in the prosecution of the State against Thomas M. Offut. Comptroller authorised to issue warrant.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage In force.

CHAPTER 319.

AN ACT for the relief of Aquila Wiles of Harford county. Passed Mar. 10, 1856.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the county commissioners of Harford county, be and they are hereby authorised to levy on the assessable property of said county, the sum of sixty dollars annually, for the use of Aquila Wiles, an insane pauper, living in said county, so long as the same may be necessary for his support. Commissioners authorised to levy.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall be in force and take effect from the date of its passage. In force.
