

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to continue in force the act passed at Passed March
3, 1858.

January session eighteen hundred and fifty-two, chapter three hundred and sixteen, also the act passed January session eighteen hundred and fifty-five, chapter forty-six, relative to the appointment of a commissioner to take testimony to perpetuate the lost records in Dorchester county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the act of Assembly passed January session eighteen hundred and fifty-two chapter three hundred and sixteen, entitled an act to authorise the appointment of a commissioner to take testimony, to provide for the recording of wills and other papers, of which the originals were lost, by the burning of the court house in Dorchester county, and to render as far as practicable, the evils likely to arise from the destruction of the records of said county, and the supplements thereto, passed at January session eighteen hundred and fifty-four, chapter forty-six and January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, chapter one hundred and three, be and the same are hereby continued in force until after the tenth of March eighteen hundred and sixty.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.
