

CHAPTER 198.

AN ACT to change the place of holding elections in the sixth Election District of Dorchester county. Passed March 5, 1858.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the place of holding the elections in the sixth Election District of Dorchester county, from and after the passage of this act, shall be at the store or dwelling house of Robert H. Creighton, in said district, instead of Fishing Creek Ferry, as now used and practised. Place of holding elections.

CHAPTER 199.

AN ACT to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned from John Hare and Catharine Hare, his wife, to Robert Morrison. Passed March 4, 1858.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the deed heretofore made and executed by John Hare and Elizabeth Hare, his wife, to Robert Morrison, of Baltimore county, State of Maryland, bearing date the fourteenth day of August, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-eight, and recorded on the third day of February in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, among the land records of Baltimore county, be and the same is hereby declared to be as valid, and of the same force, operation and effect, in law or equity, to all intents and purposes as if the said deed had been recorded as provided by law for recording deeds; *Provided,* that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prejudice the rights of any purchaser for valuable consideration, or any *bona fide* creditor whose interest or rights have accrued since the execution and acknowledgment of said deed. Made valid. Proviso.
