AN ACT to make valid deeds and other in- Passed March 9, 1858. struments of writing, defective in the acknowledgment or in the certificate thereof.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assem- Deeds and othbly of Maryland, That all deeds and other instru- of writing dements of writing which have been executed and clared valid. acknowledged and are recorded in this State, previous to the passage of this act, which may not have been acknowledged according to the laws existing at the time of such acknowledgment, or where the certificate of acknowledgment is not in the prescribed form, be and the same are hereby made valid to all intents and purposes, as if the said acknowledgment and the certificate thereof had been in legal form; Provided, that said deeds Provisos. and other instruments in other respects are in conformity with the laws; And provided further, that nothing in this act shall affect the interests of bona fide purchasers or creditors without notice, who may have become so previous to the passage of this act.
