

Inspector shall forfeit and pay upon conviction, the sum of one thousand dollars, and ever after be incompetent to hold and discharge the office of an Inspector under the laws of this State.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That if any purchaser of grain shall fail or refuse to take or receive the same, and charge or allege that the bulk is not equal in quality to the sample by which he purchased, and it shall appear that six hours have passed since the sale took place, and no complaint has been made to the seller or his agent within that time, it shall be presumed, unless clearly proved to the contrary, that the bulk does correspond with the sample, and the said purchaser shall be compelled to pay all damages and charges that may have arisen by reason of his delay or refusal to comply with his contract; to be assessed and determined by the said Inspector General.

In case of refusal to comply with contract.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That if any owner or agent of any owner of grain, or any buyer of or dealer in grain, shall fraudulently alter or change any sample of any grain that may have been drawn and inspected by any Inspector under this act appointed, with a view and for the purpose of improving or deteriorating its quality, shall upon conviction before any Justice of the Peace, of the State of Maryland, in and for the city of Baltimore, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars; and in case he feels aggrieved, he shall have the right of appeal within thirty days after the rendition of the judgment, and upon giving good and sufficient bond, with sureties to be approved by the said Justice, to prosecute his said appeal with effect, to the next term of the criminal court, in the city of Baltimore.

In case of fraud

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted*, That every Inspector under the provisions of this act, before he proceeds to act as such, shall, under the penalty of five hundred dollars, upon conviction, take and subscribe the following oath, in addition to other oaths required by the constitution and laws of the State, to wit: I, A. B., appointed Inspector of grain in the city of Baltimore, do swear, or solemnly, sincerely and truly declare and affirm, that I will diligently and carefully weigh and
