

CHAPTER 379.

AN ACT allowing compensation to William C. Cunningham, William D. Grim, John L. Herring, James L. Dorsey, James H. Stone, Charles A. Talbott, Benjamin Dyer and Charles H. Bowen, agents for the collection of taxes in arrears in the city of Baltimore, due the State of Maryland. Passed March 9, 1858.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Charles A. Talbott, Benjamin Dyer and Charles H. Bowen, be allowed each the sum of two hundred dollars, and that William C. Cunningham, William D. Grim, John L. Herring, James H. Stone and James L. Dorsey, be allowed each the sum of six hundred dollars, as compensation for the collection of taxes in arrears, due in the city of Baltimore, and paid into the Treasury of the State. Compensation.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from its passage. to take effect.

CHAPTER 380.

AN ACT appropriating a sum of money to pay Eliza Herring, Executrix of William H. Herring, deceased, for a commission under an appointment of the Governor of Maryland, paid by the said William H. Herring, in his life time to the clerk of the Superior court of Baltimore city. Passed March 8, 1858.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury, be and he is hereby authorised and directed to issue his warrant to the Treasurer, authorising and directing him to pay out of any unappropriated funds in the Treasury, to Eliza Herring, Executrix of William H. Herring, the Comptroller authorised to issue warrant.
