CHAPTER 427.

AN ACT to prevent the filling up of Harbors in Passed March Somerset county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful to fill up harbors or anchorage cast over any oysters or oyster shells, ballast or grounds. any other thing, upon the bottom of any Harbor or anchoring ground, by means of which any such Harbor or place accustomed to be used as an anchoring ground for vessels within the bounds of Somerset county, may be filled up, or by which vessels lying at anchor, or the free and easy access of vessels to and from said Harbor or anchoring grounds may be in any manner hindered or obstructed.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That any person or Penalty for persons violating the provisions of this act, be or violating prothey shall be fined a sum of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars in the discretion of the Court, upon indictment and conviction in the Circuit Court of said county, or upon conviction be-fore any Justice of the Peace of the same; and for fore any Justice of the Peace of the same; and for the second offence, he or they shall be fined not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars in the
