Be it Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Wharfinger, be and he is hereby directed, to allot to the said Mason L. Weems and others, owners and commanders of the steamers Patuxent, Planter and Mary Washington, for the use and occupation of said line of steamers, two hundred feet frontage of the State of Maryland's wharf, opposite the State Tobacco Warehouse, (No. 2,) in the city of Baltimore, commencing for the same, at Smith's wharf, and extending two hundred feet, at and for the yearly rent of one thousand dollars, to be paid to the State Wharfinger, in quarterly payments, of two hundred and fifty dollars each, and at that rate for so long a time as they may continue to use and occupy the same; *Provided*, that nothing herein contained, shall be construed to enlarge the rights and privileges now and heretofore enjoyed by the said parties; and that the Legislature reserves to itself the right to repeal, alter or modify the above resolutions at pleasure.
