Penalty for refee than allowed

3. And be it enacted, That if any constable shall take or receive, either directly or indirectly, any greater fee or reward than what is allowed by this act for such services, he shall forfeit the sum of one hundred dollars for every such offence, one half to go to the school funds of the several counties of this state, and the other half to the informer thereof, to be recovered in the county court of the county where the offence shall be committed, or the city court of Baltimore, if in the city of Baltimore, by bill of indictment.

New board of 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That commissioners ap. Upton Beall, Thomas A. Brook, William Wilson, Howard Griffith. John H. Riggs, William Wilson, of John, George B. Hays, Thomas T. Wheeler, Basil Darby, John Rabbit, and Thomas Gettings, be and they are hereby appointed and substituted as a separate independent board of commissioners of the school fund for Montgomery county, in lieu of the persons heretofore appointed; which commissioners herein named shall have and exercise all the power and authorities vested in the commissioners for Montgomery county by the act to which this is a further supplement, and they may supply all vacancies happening in their board, so that the same shall always consist of at least eleven members.
