Section 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not hereafter be lawful prohibited. for the mayor and city council of Baltimore, to collect or impose any tax, duty, toll or wharfage upon any goods, wares or merchandise or other articles, for the passing the same over any of the public wharves within the said city; Provided always, That nothing herein contained shall be so taken or construed as to deprive the said corporation of the right of regulating by ordinance, the time during which any goods, wares or merchandise, or other articles, shall remain on the said public wharves, or the time which the vessels, boats or scows, taking in or discharging such goods, wares or merchandise, shall remain at said wharves.

AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the said Matthias Dashiell before he proceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for officers' lees or public dues in virtue of this act, to deliver to such person or persons, chargeable with the sa me, at least thirty days previous to levying such execution or distress, an account written in words at full length, of the officers fees or public dues demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit annexed if required, that he hath not received any part thereof, nor any thing as security or satisfaction for the same more than credits given, to the best of his knowledge.
