of such application; and if the said occupier or occupiers will not then permit such chimney to be swept or will not appoint a time within twenty four hours thereafter for the sweeping of the same, or will not permit such chimney to be swept at the time which may be so appointed, he, she or they shall pay to the superintendant, the same sum of mo-

ney as if such chimney had been swept by hum;

Fee for sweep. ing- penalty for excess.

6. AND BE IT ENACTED, That no superintendant licensed as aforesaid shall demand or receive from any person or persons directly or indirectly for his services any other or greater fee or rates, than are berein allowed, under the penalty of five dollars for every such offence, to wit : For a chimney of one story, eight cents; of two stories twelve and a half cents; three stories, fifteen cents; four or more stories eighteen cents; and if any chimney in the said precints shall take are and blaze out at the top, the superintendant within whose district the said chimney may be, shall forfeit and pay to the commissioners ten dollars ; Provided nevertheless, That such forfeiture shall be paid by the occupier or occupiers of the house or room wherein such chim ey may be, in case he, she or they would not permit such cuimney to be swept upon application being made as required by this act.

Compensation of commissioners & their sierk.

7. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners shall be allowed two dollars per day, and their clerk two dollars per day for every day they may attend to the discharge of the duties required of them by this act, and the cierk shall be allowed six per cent out of all monies collect d by him under this act; and all monies to be cotleeted under the provisions of this act, except fine and forfeitures, snatt be recovered as directed by the eighth sec-

tion of the law to which this is a supplement.

Application of fines.

8. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all fines and penakies hereby imposed, shall be recovered and applied as directed in the seventeenth section of the act to which this is a supplement.
