A supplement to an act entitled, "An act to open and extend Queen street in the city of Baltimore.

Sec. 1. BEIT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That in case the person or persons chargeable with the payment of any sum or sums of money for benefits derived from the opening and extending of said street in pu suance of the act to which this is a supplement, shall neglector refuse to make such payments to the city commissioners of Baltimore, within one month af er the passage of this a.t, then it shall be the duty of the collector of the taxes of the said city, and he is hereby authorised to collect by distress or otherwise such sum or sums, and he or they as the case may be shall pay over the same to the person or persons entitled thereto under the said original act, first deducting and retaining out of such sums the paving tax due from the person or persons so enucled, for paying said sierats.
