An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under

the title of The Consolidated Bank of Maryland. 27, 1816.
Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Incorporated: Maryland, That a bank to be called and known by the title of The Consolidated Bank of Maryland, shall be established in the county of Baltimore, and without the precincts of the city

of Baltimore: 2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the capital of the said bank shall be five hundred thousand dollars, money of the United States, to consist of five thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, to be apportioned among the several incorporated banks out of the city of Baltimore, and such as may be incorporated during the present session, according to the limi-

ations of their respective charters. 3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That books of subscription for the said capital shall be opened in the city of Baltimore, opened. under the direction of Henry H.
