CHAPTER 51.

An act for introducing a copious supply of water into the town of Cumberland.

Passed Jan.
5, 1816.

Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a company be and they are hereby incorporated and made a body politic, for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, and that the said body politic shall be known and distinguished by the appellation of The President and Directors of the Cumberland Water Company, and shall have full and ample power and authority to do, perform and execute, all and every matter and thing which a similar corporation may or rightfully can do, and shall have succession during the continuation of this act; and to that end, for perpetuating the said incorporate body, the heirs, devisees, representatives, and assignees of the individual members thereof, shall be, and are hereby declared to be members thereof, and by the name aforesaid may sue and be sued, answer and be answered, in any court of law or equity in this state or elsewhere.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the capital stock of the said corporation shall not exceed ten thousand dollars, to be divided into five hundred shares of twenty dollars each, and that subscriptions to the said capital stock shall be opened in the town of Cumberland, under the direction of John Scott, Peter Londermilk, Samuel Smith, George Thistle, David Schriver, and Michael C. Sprigg or any two or more of them, on a day appointed by them for that purpose, and notified in
