An act for the benefit of Reuben Long, of the City of Baltimorre.

SEC. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Reuben Long be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to remove, import and bring into this state, at any time within one year after the passage of this act, a negro slave called Tom, any law to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
