CHAPTER 230.

An act to pay the Civil List, and other expenses of Civil Passed Feb. 4. Government.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, Preamble. to the public, ought to receive a reasonable compensation for

their services,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Officers salaries the following officers of the civil government, for the time being, shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries, in current money, for the ensuing year, to wit : The treasurer of the western shore, two thousand dollars; the treasurer of the eastern shore, four hundred and fifty dollars; the auditor, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the council, one thousand dollars; the clerk of the senate, one hundred and fifty dollars; the clerk of the house of delegates, three hundred dollars; the printer to the state, fourteen hundred dollars; the messenger to the council, two hundred and fifty dollars.
