CHAPTER 91.

An Additional Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to In-  
corporate the Stockholders in the Hager's-Town Bank.

Passed Jan 17

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,*  
That the president and directors of the Hager's-Town Bank are  
hereby authorised and empowered, to sell at public auction, or  
otherwise, any real property which the said corporation now  
holds ; and the president of said bank, for the time being, shall  
be fully empowered to convey the same by a good and sufficient  
deed of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers of said real  
property.

CHAPTER 92.

An act appointing Commissioners to Revise and Correct  
the Original Plot of the Town of Cumberland, in Alle-  
gany County.

Passed Jan. 17

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by peti-  
tion of Thomas Beall, of Samuel, proprietor of the town of  
Cumberland, in Allegany county, that by virtue of an act of as-  
sembly, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and five,  
appointing Roger Perry, George Hoffman, Jonathan Cox, Evan  
Gwynn and Upton Bruce, commissioners to mark and bound the  
said town, in the execution of the powers vested in them by vir-  
tue of said act, the surveyor employed by the said commissioners  
has made some errors that cannot be corrected without legisla-  
tive interference ; Therefore,

Preamble.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,*  
That Roger Perry, George Hoofman, Jonathan Cox, Evan  
Gwynn and Adam Segur, senior, be and the same are hereby  
appointed commissioners, with full power and authority, with  
the assistance of the surveyor of said county, to revise and cor-  
rect any errors appearing in the original plot of said town,  
with as full and ample powers as were vested in the commission-  
ers appointed by the aforesaid act of 1805.
