An act to lay out and open a road in Cecil county, shall pass, or his, her, or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive him, her or themselves, aggrieved by the valuation of the commissioners acting under the said act, it shall and may be lawful for any justice of the peace of Cecil county, on his, her, or their application, to issue his warrant, under his hand and seal, directed to the sheriff of the said county, commanding him to summon twelve disinterested men, qualified by law to serve as jurors in the county court, to meet upon the premises on a certain day, of which six days notice shall be given to the party or parties interested; and the said jurors, when so met, and having each taken an oath before some justice of the peace that he will, without favour, affection or partiality, assess the damages sustained by the person or persons at whose request the said inquisition shall be taken, by reason of opening the aforesaid road through his, her, or their land, shall thereupon proceed to assess and value the damages accordingly, taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages, if any, and such inquisition shall be final and conclusive between the parties respectively.
