

Passed Feb 19 1819

Relative to building light house on Bodkin point.

No. 48.
WHEREAS, it appearing to this general assembly, that the erection of a light-house on the Bodkin Point in this state, would be of great importance to the commerce of the United States, by rendering the navigation of the Chesapeake-Bay more secure; therefore,

RESOLVED, That our senators and representatives in congress be and they are hereby requested, to use their best endeavours to procure a light-house to be erected on the Bodkin-Point in this state.

RESOLVED, That the governor be and he is hereby requested, to transmit a copy of the above resolution to the senators and representatives of this state in congress.

In favour of Printer to the state.

No. 49.
RESOLVED, That the printer to the state be allowed twenty days, in addition to the time limited by law, for printing the laws and votes and proceedings of the present session, and that the treasurer of the western shore advance to him the sum of seven hundred dollars, in part of the salary allowed him on the civil list for the present year, upon his giving bond and security as required by the law of December session 1816, ch. 98.

Relative to the Auditor.

No. 50.
RESOLVED, That the governor be and he is hereby authorised and empowered, to take the bond of the Auditor of the state, in the penalty heretofore required, with such sureties as he shall approve.

In favour of clerks

No. 51.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John Brewer, clerk of the house of delegates, to Richard Harwood, chief clerk of the senate, to John R. Pitt, assistant clerk to the house of delegates, and to John N. Watkins, assistant clerk of the senate, the sum of one hundred dollars each, as an additional compensation for their extraordinary services during the present session.

In favour of Jonathan Waters.

No. 52.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Jonathan Waters, a revolutionary soldier, in quarterly payments during life, the half pay of a private.

Passed Feb 19 1819

In favour of Thos. Turner.

No. 53.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Thomas Turner of Montgomery county, or his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, for his services during the revolutionary war.

Passed Feb 19 1819

In favour of Paul Minitree.

No. 54.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Paul Minitree, an old soldier of Charles county, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, for his services during the revolutionary war.

In favour of Jas. Hewitt

No. 55.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to James Hewitt, or to his order, the half pay of a private, in quarterly payments during life.

Passed Feb 19 1819

In favour of Capt. Wm. Damsell.

No. 56.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to captain William Damsell, of Cecil county, or his order, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the sum of ninety-five dollars and sixty-four cents, being the amount of the damages and costs recovered from him by a certain Thomas Rutter in Cecil county court, at the April term thereof, in the year eighteen hundred and seventeen, in consequence of the said William Damsell having impressed the horse of said Thomas Rutter, at the instance of his superior officer, during the late war, which said horse was never afterwards restored to the said Thomas Rutter.

In favour of Philemon Griffith.

No. 57.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Philemon Griffith, an old revolutionary officer, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a major.

Passed Feb 19 1819

In favour of John Head.

No. 58.
RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, to John Head, an old revolutionary soldier, or his order annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services.
